SPECIAL REPORTS:

- Grants Management Northwest - Barbara Engstrom - Barbara presented their plans for the next 12 months. They will be working closely with the hospital foundation and with North Central Washington Collaborative to explore opportunities for aggressive fund raising.

- Sanctuary Jane Jedwabny The Sanctuary is a dual diagnosis program which often includes both a chemical dependency and mental health diagnosis. This setting is ideal for patients because we are located in the hospital, have medical assistance and psychiatric assistance as well. Program is counselor driven. They manage and maintain their patients.
- 1st Quarter Quality Dashboard Brad reviewed the first quarter 2011 quality dashboard. All indicators are currently green with the exception of medication reconciliation which is yellow.

STATE OF THE HOSPITAL REPORTS

Quality Report -Brad Hankins, COO

- Exploring changes to quality indicators.
- JCAHO measures industry standards and is looking at standardizing monitors for CAH's

Chief Nursing Officer - Carol Velasquez, CNO

- To insure patient safety the nurses are performing bedside medication verification, by scanning the patient and medication using the Dolphin system. They are striving to achieve as close to 100% accuracy as possible.
- Jenni Hernandez passed the State Pharmacy Technician exam.
- National Nurses' week begins May 6th and continues through May 12th. Nursing leadership has a number of things planned to acknowledge the patient centered care and the caring our nurses provide.
- The nurses have a key role in the "Partnership for Patients: Better Care, Lower Costs", a new public-private partnership to help improve quality, safety, and affordability of health care.

Chief Executive Officer - Kevin Abel, CEO

- The next ER physician interview will be held May 9th.
- Our YTD February net income is at \$70,121.
- Wipfli estimates our Medicare cost report settlement to be close to \$1.5 million.
- The contribution level at LCCH for the Washington Hospital Compensation Program is .04842 per worker hour, which is the lowest in the State. The average level is .07617.
- The State Legislature reported a \$5.1 billion shortfall. The Senate has proposed reductions to the health care industry.
- Lake Chelan Community Apartments has completed the Phase I Environmental Review and the Capital Needs Assessment. The environment assessment found pipes that may lead to an underground tank under the parking lot.
- It was recommended not to pay off the LCCA loan due to a required notice that would have to be sent to the tenants regarding their rent, and an early pay off could disrupt any rehabilitation funding associated with Wenatchee Housing Authority.
- SB5116 passed providing hospital districts the authority to fundraise with the foundations.
- In 2013 the Value Based Purchasing project will reduce PPS hospital payments by 1% and use the money to reward quality.
