REVIEW OF MISSION:

Our Mission is to provide patient-centered, quality healthcare with compassion and respect.

I. PRESENTATION

- A. Presentation of Replacement Hospital Project Kevin Abel, CEO
 - a. Replacement hospital discussions have been held in the community for several years.
 - b. Outside consultants including Healthcare Collaborative Group, WIPFLi and Health Facilities Planning and Development have consulted on the replacement hospital project.
 - c. The district can expect population growth by 2030 according to the master facilities strategic plan.
 - d. The hospital district has a higher population of seniors as compared to Washington state average.
 - e. Community forums and community focus groups have been held on the replacement hospital project. The feedback from those forums was positive with the majority of the public favoring a replacement facility.
 - f. 12 acres of flat land is owned by the hospital district
 - g. Improvements include private rooms, increased capacity in emergency department, increased space in laboratory, larger operating rooms, OB suites, PT/OT area designed for the function, consolidated radiology services, and a building that meets modern codes.
 - h. Improved electrical, HVAC, and plumbing systems as compared to existing facility.
 - i. Helipad availability.
 - j. Site plans and schematic drawings of the facility were reviewed.
- B. Service Area
 - a. Official PHD #2 Service area includes Stehekin, Manson, Chelan, and Chelan Falls.
 - b. Secondary service area- Orondo and Mansfield
- C. USDA Financing Program Kelly Arduino, WIPFLi CPAs and Consultants
 - a. To qualify for USDA the facility must be in a rural area.
 - b. Current USDA rate currently is 3.375% with no application or other fees attached.
 - c. USDA examines our financial forecast and environmental assessment on the state level, then the federal level for approval.
 - d. We have a public/private partnership established, which is considered a good mix for the budget.
